The Passing of a Neighbor and Friend

We have known Lucy and her family since we first arrived in Corquín, almost nine years ago. We enjoyed getting to know them and being friends. Sadly, three years ago Lucy's husband Carlos went illegally to the States leaving her and their children behind. Since then, both Lucy's mental and physical health have declined. The last six months has been the hardest for her. Doctors tried prescribing different medicines to help, but nothing did. Kris spent time with her praying and sharing scripture, but Lucy lost interest in that and became withdrawn. On the 24th she was admitted into the hospital and died on the following day. She leaves behind two wonderful children, Andrea, 14, and Carlos, 10. Andrea had attended youth group and Bible camp, and Carlos attends our Bible classes regularly. Kris spent

the following two days with their family, helping by making meals, comforting, and baking bread to serve all the visitors during the wake. Please pray for this family and us as we stive to minister to this family in the weeks and months to come.
