Last year in November, when we served coffee and bread to our local maternity/emergency medical clinic, one of the nurses made us aware of a particular need they had. When women come to the maternity clinic to have their babies, many come without anything for their child like diapers, blankets, wipes, or clothes. The clinic is not supplied with any of the basics things to care for these babies nor to offer any help to the parents.

Someone who was aware of the situation donated money so we could provide some supplies to the clinic in order for them to share with the mothers who come unprepared. In addition to these funds, members of the congregation donated wipes, clothes, and baby shampoo. Several women, along with RADICAL, made the delivery this month. We are praying that this will be a blessing to many new moms and their babies.

RADICAL was teaching on the value of compassion one week this month and decided to put their lesson into practice. In the public hospitals, food is not always served to the patients. Family members must bring food in to provide for them. Often people arrive at the hospital from a long distance away and don't have a place to stay so they sleep on the ground outside the hospital. It's extremely sad and our RADICAL members wanted to bless them in the name of the Lord.

They pooled their money and had two hundred and fifty tamales made to serve at the hospital in Santa Rosa. We invited the church there to join us, and they generously provided the coffee and helped us serve. It was a great experience for the team and the others who served. We are thrilled that the lessons RADICAL is teaching are making a difference in more than just the lives of the students we teach here in Corquín.

Beginning this month, Kris and Uliana began meeting in groups with both the young adult girls and the teen girls to start building closer relationships with them. Most of the young adult girls are already Christians, but not all. None of the teen girls are followers of Christ. This is an amazing opportunity to reach out and influence the next generation. Kris invited Mery and Ana, a couple of the young adults, to attend and to think about being role models for the younger ones.
